Course Description: EBP paradigm and EBP process are the foundation of this course. Concepts, models, and methods for translation and implementation of research into practice are applied. Evaluation methods of the processes and outcomes of implementation and practice change are discussed. Principles of sustainable evidence-based practice changes across disciplines and within various healthcare settings are included.
