Course Overview:

The primary purpose of this course is to examine the physical, cognitive, and social development of infants, children, adolescents, and adults, and the various factors (e.g., genetics, parenting, peer groups, schools) that influence development. Prominent theories of development and research methods used in developmental psychology are reviewed. Specific topics that are covered include: prenatal development, aggression, attachment, gender development, language development, moral development, cognitive development, cultural influences, school settings, and aging.

This is a face to face, in person class. I will generally introduce each topic with some background information and/or lecture on some selected aspect of each topic, but much of what you learn from the class will be information that you glean from the readings and class discussions. Active student attendance and participation will be required

Evaluation and Grading:

EXAMS: There will be 3 non-cumulative exams that cover material from class and the readings. The first 2 exams will take place during a regular class period, and the 3rd exam will take place during the final exam period (though it is NOT a cumulative final, it covers the last unit of material). Each non-cumulative exam will be worth **20% of your final grade.** The exams will utilize multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank, and essay formats.

Make up exams: Make-up exams will be given under *compelling* circumstances. If you need to make-up an exam, please let me know as soon as possible that you will not be able to take them exam on the scheduled day. Make-up exams will be in the same format as the regular exams, but will be an alternate version of the test (i.e., different questions than the rest of the class got).

WEEKLY QUIZZES: Each week there will be a Canvas quiz on the material covered in the book and in class. These will be released each Tuesday and will be due by Sunday. The goal of these quizzes is to help you ensure that you are keeping up with and absorbing the material as we go along rather than cramming before exams.

APPLICATION Mini-Projects: You will need to complete 2 application assignments throughout the course of the semester. This is an opportunity for you to experience and think about factors that influence development in a real-world setting, apply what you have learned in the class, and reflect on ways that the place or resource could be improved based on what you know about human development. The assignments are spread out over the course of the semester, and you will need to pick 2 of them to complete. Detailed instructions for each of the assignments appear on Canvas. The topics are:

- 1. Infant Care Interview
- 2. Pt 2 of Playful learning project
- 3. Work Life Balance Infographic
- 4. Ageism Reflection
- 5. Independent project ***Requires Professor approval***
