

**HIST 3397/5397: World War II and the Holocaust in Poland (Study Abroad)**

**Course Description:**

This course explores the Second World War and the Holocaust in Central Europe through readings, discussion, lectures, and a trip to Poland. We will tour major and minor historic sites, monuments, and cultural sites on a range of topics regarding the conflict and its consequences. Travel and tours will be contextualized with readings and discussions in order to gain a strong understanding and appreciation for the course and consequences of World War II and the Holocaust in Poland specifically and central Europe as a whole.

**Content Objectives:**

Upon completion of this course, students should be able to:

1. Demonstrate a strong understanding of the causes, course, and consequences of the Second World War and the Holocaust in Europe generally and Poland specifically.
2. Think critically and objectively about the Second World War and the Holocaust in Central Europe and Poland's role in the broader course of the global conflict.
3. Develop analytical skills through thinking, speaking, touring, and writing about history generally and the Second World War and Holocaust specifically.

**Assignments:**

- Tour (50 pts)
  - o Conduct a brief 15-minute on-site tour for the class in Poland. Locations TBA.
- Presentation (50 pts)
  - o Deliver a brief 15-minute presentation for the campus community when we return.
- Paper (75 pts)
  - o Write a brief (2,500-word, double-spaced; **Grad: 5,000-word, double spaced**) paper on the same site.
- Book Reviews (2x25 = 50) **(Graduate: 3x16.5)**
  - o Write a 700-word synopsis of all required books.
- Attendance and Active Participation (300 pts)
  - o Attend and actively participate in all course related events in Texas and in Poland. Failure to do so (without instructor consent) will result in a zero on the attendance/participation.

**Attendance, Participation, and Decorum:**

This is an upper-level university course. Attendance and participation are mandatory. Considering the nature of this travel course, it is imperative that you show up on time for all meetings, tours, and any other class-wide event. *All* students must attend *all* class events. Failure to do so without instructor consent will result in a zero on the participation grade.
