#### **Course Title:**

"Voices of Resistance: 20th-Century Latin American Women Writers"

## **Course Description:**

In this study I will examine the contributions of Latin American women writers during the late 20th century. I will be focusing on themes such as gender, resistance, identity, motherhood, and the joining of politics and personal life. I will complete this by reading key texts from authors such as Isabel Allende, Sandra Cisneros, and Julia Alverez. I will also read selections of poetry and critical essays found in *Making Face, Making Soul Haciendo Caras* edited by Gloria Anzaldua, as well *as Latin-American Women Writers: Class, Race, and Gender* by Myriam Yvonne Jehenson. My study will explore how these writers responded to political turmoil, colonial legacies, and patriarchal oppression. I will engage with novels, short stories, essays, and poetry. I will analyze how these works resist the more dominant narratives of Latin America. By doing so I hope to articulate alternative visions for social justice and cultural identity in Latin America.

# **Course Objectives:**

By the end of this course, I will:

- 1. Understand key themes in 20th-century Latin American women's literature, including gender roles, political resistance, and cultural identity.
- 2. Analyze the works of prominent Latin American women writers in the context of historical and political events.
- 3. Examine how these writers navigate the intersections of personal and collective struggles, particularly in relation to gender and social justice.
- 4. Develop critical reading and writing skills through close analysis of both primary texts and secondary scholarship.
- 5. Engage with feminist literary theory as it applies to Latin American women's writing.

#### **Course Schedule**

# Week 1: Introduction to Latin American Women's Writing

- Readings:
  - o Introduction from Latin-American Women Writers: Class, Race, and Gender
  - o Introduction from Making Face, Making Soul Haciendo Caras
- Assignment: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

## Week 2: Isabel Allende

- **Readings**: *The House of the Spirits* (Chapters 1-5)
- **Assignment**: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

## **Week 3: Magical Realism**

- **Readings**: *The House of the Spirits* (Finish the novel)
- **Assignment**: Write a short essay (500-800 words) on how Allende uses magical realism to critique colonial legacies, and patriarchal oppression.

#### Week 4: Sandra Cisneros

- **Readings**: *The House on Mango Street* (Entire book)
- **Assignment**: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

## Week 5: Space and Identity in Cisneros' Work

- **Readings**: No new readings this week, focus on essay.
- **Assignment**: Write an essay (800-1,000 words) on how space (neighborhood, home) influences the characters' sense of self in *The House on Mango Street*.

## Week 6: Julia Alvarez's Essays

- **Readings**: Something to Declare (Selected essays)
- Assignment: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

## Week 7: Women and Revolution

- Readings: Selected poems from Making Face, Making Soul
- **Assignment**: Create a PowerPoint presentation comparing how two different writers respond to political turmoil in their works.

# Week 8: Feminist Perspectives in Latin American Writing

- **Readings**: Selections from *Making Face, Making Soul* (focus on feminist writings)
- Assignment: Write an essay connecting feminist theory to the primary texts discussed.

#### Week 9: Motherhood

- **Readings**: Selected essays from *Latin-American Women Writers* (focus on writings on motherhood)
- **Assignment**: Write a comparative analysis (700-1,000 words) of motherhood in *The House of the Spirits* and *The House on Mango Street*.

- Readings: Selections from Latin-American Women Writers
- Assignment: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

- **Readings**: Selections from *Latin-American Women Writers*
- Assignment: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the week's readings.

#### Week 13: Julia Alvarez

- **Readings**: *In the Time of Butterflies* (first half of the novel)
- **Assignment**: No assignment, concentrate on close reading.

## Week 14: Julia Alvarez

- **Readings**: *In the Time of Butterflies* (finish the novel)
- **Assignment**: Write a short essay (500-700 words) on themes found in *In the Time of Butterflies*.

## **Week 15: Final Reflections**

- Readings: Review key selections from the course texts
- **Assignment**: Write a short reflection (300 words) on the texts from this semester, focus on the texts you will write final paper on.

## Week 16: Final Due

- **Readings**: No new readings, focus on final paper.
- **Assignment**: Final research paper due (2,000 words) April 30.
