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## **About this Required Capstone Course**

ENGL 5397 Guided Integrative Study is a required course and the capstone of the UT Tyler English master's program. It must be taken during a long semester--either spring or fall; it is not offered during the summer. If you are within nine (9) hours of completing your degree for non-thesis students or within twelve (12) hours for thesis students, please access and read the information by reading the sections and by clicking on the ENGL 5397 GIS links below. NOTE: ENGL 5397 (GIS) & ENGL 5396 (thesis) cannot be taken concurrently. The GIS must be taken prior to enrolling in thesis hours. So, if you plan to write a thesis, plan accordingly.

# 1. The initial step: ENGL 5397 GIS PERMISSION TO ENROLL FORM

In the semester prior to the taking the GIS and right after registration opens for the semester in which the GIS is to be taken, this form must be completed and emailed to the English graduate director (currently Dr. Tara Propper) at englishma@uttyler.edu). The Graduate Director will check your degree plan to make sure that you are eligible to take the GIS. Before completing the form be sure to have a GIS topic selected and confirmation from your GIS director and reader that they will serve on your GIS committee.

## 2. Checklist of Due Dates for Students Enrolled in the GIS

Attached is a schedule the sequence of the various GIS assignments that are requirement for the course. #### 3. The GIS Portfolio

In addition to submitting the completed GIS portfolio to the GIS director in accordance with the GIS director's instructions, the M.A. candidate must submit a clean electronic copy of the portfolio to the current English graduate advisor (Dr. Propper) at <a href="mailto:englishma@uttyler.edu">englishma@uttyler.edu</a>. The portfolio should be submitted to the graduate during finals week of the GIS semester.

For submission, components of the portfolio should be formatted as <u>one</u> Word file. The file should contain a title page and a table of contents. The student's name should only appear on the title page. It should include the following items in the order listed:

- GIS paper proposal (approximately 250 words, if required by GIS director)
- Research Plan / Proposed Methodology (approximately 500 words, if required by GIS director)
- Annotated Bibliography (20-25 sources)
- Literature Review (Historical-Bibliographical Essay (8-10 pages))
- Take-home GIS Exit Examination Essay (approx 8-12 pages)
- List of 5 revised Prompts/Questions for the GIS Exit Examination
- GIS Paper (approx. 20-25 pages)
