Course Description: This course is a study of measures of central tendency and dispersion, sampling, probability and confidence intervals.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, students should be able to do the following:

- 1. Explain the use of data collection and statistics as tools to reach reasonable conclusions.
- 2. Recognize, examine and interpret the basic principles of describing and presenting data.
- 3. Compute and interpret empirical and theoretical probabilities using the rules of probabilities and combinatorics.
- 4. Examine, analyze and compare various sampling distributions for both discrete and continuous random variables.
- 5. Describe and compute confidence intervals.
- 6. Solve linear regression and correlation problems.
- 7. Perform hypothesis testing using statistical methods.
