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# Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes

#### **Course Objectives**

Develop and improve technical, musical, and performing skills on piano through standard classical and pedagogical repertoire

#### **Learning Outcomes**

At the conclusion of this course, students will sightread and perform technical skills and repertoire appropriate for each level of study and degree emphasis as outlined below

#### All degrees

- 3 'quick study' pieces within current reading ability level
- Technique focusing on sound quality, physical ease, and scale/arpeggio fingerings
- SASR Score 300-499
- Functional theory skills from Harmony & Keyboard I & II classes
- Piano Performance majors 4 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 8 and at least 3 selections must be memorized
- Piano Pedagogy majors 4 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 6 and at least 2 selections must be memorized
- BA students and Piano Concentrations 3 selections covering 3 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 5 and at least 1 selection must be memorized
- Electives 2 4 selections in varying styles
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 2 and at least 1 selection must be memorized

#### All degrees

- 4 'quick study' pieces within current reading ability level
- Technique focusing on upper division jury requirements
- SASR Score 500-699
- Functional theory skills from Harmony & Keyboard III & IV classes
- Piano Performance majors 4 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 9 and at least 3 selections must be memorized
- Piano Pedagogy majors 4 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 7 and at least 2 selections must be memorized
- BA students, Piano Concentrations 3 selections covering 3 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 6 and at least 1 selection must be memorized
- **Electives** 2 4 selections in varying styles
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 3 and at least 1 selection must be memorized

#### All Degrees

- 5 'quick study' pieces within current reading ability level
- Technique focusing on problem solving and enhanced voicing skills
- SASR Score 700-899
- Piano Performance majors 5 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 10 and at least 4 selections must be memorized
- Piano Pedagogy majors 4 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 8 and at least 2 selections must be memorized
- BA students, Piano Concentrations 3 selections covering 3 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 7 and at least 1 selection must be memorized
- **Electives** 2 4 selections in varying styles
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 4 and at least 1 selection must be memorized

#### All Degrees

- 5 'quick study' pieces within current reading ability level
- Technique focusing on continued problem solving and expanding tonal control and color
- SASR Score 900 and higher
- Piano Performance majors 6 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 10 and at least 4 selections must be memorized
- Piano Pedagogy majors 5 selections covering 4 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 9 and at least 3 selections must be memorized
- BA students, Piano Concentrations 3 selections covering 3 stylistic periods
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 8 and at least 1 selection must be memorized
- Electives 2 4 selections in varying styles
  - Repertoire levels should be a minimum level 5 and at least 1 selection must be memorized

### Practice Requirements

#### Minimum practice schedule

Set a daily schedule to evenly divide required hours over at least 5 days

- BA, Piano Concentrations, and Electives: 7 hours per week
- Piano Pedagogy majors: 10 hours per week
- Piano performance majors: 15 hours per week


Track progress on Learning Goals

# Special Course Notes

- **Attendance** is expected at all lessons and advance notice must be given if missing a lesson for illness or other excused absence. A grade of zero will be assigned for any unexcused absence. Zoom or makeup lessons may be an option depending on circumstances.
- Required materials: All repertoire must be purchased or legally downloaded in order to play for jury.
- Meeting minimum practice requirements per week is expected. Set a daily schedule to evenly divide required hours over at least 5
  days
- Weekly grades are based on meeting both practice expectations and learning goals worked out in each lesson. Learning mindful
  practicing skills is imperative to success in the course and lessons will focus on specific strategies as needed. Weekly grades will be
  posted in Canvas so that you can track your grade throughout the semester.
- A Learning Goals Spreadsheet is recommended for a practicing outline to help you complete all requirements by performance or jury
  dates. It should be followed closely and brought to each lesson to mark progress. Some flexibility is permitted, but consistent failure to
  meet weekly goals indicates a need for either more time &/or more efficient use of practice time.
