This course is designed to introduce you to the process of studying "classical" music, and to provide a one-semester overview of the development of western classical music from the the Middle Ages to the modern era. This course fulfills the university Core Curriculum requirement in Creative Arts for all majors outside of music.

After reading all of this syllabus, please begin in Module 1: What is Music?

## Course Scope & Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, you should be able to:

- 1. Identify major composers, representative musical works, genres and general style characteristics for each period of western music history.
- 2. Understand the relationship between societal, cultural and musical developments throughout history.
- 3. Write knowledgeably about various musical styles and historical periods in the context of listening to representative

#### Required Course Materials

A notebook, a good pen and consistent internet.

## Class Format & Pacing

This course will be taught online using Canvas modules and multi-media streams. While this class is 'asynchronous,' that is, not a live stream, I have worked to write modules and find examples that I think you will find engaging, thoughtprovoking and fun. Please progress through the course modules in a consistent, regular way. I have provided start dates and links to each module below and in the Canvas calendar with which I highly recommend you keep up. You are free to progress through this course as quickly as you like, but please avoid falling behind.

There are six Canvas tests in this course covering the major periods of Western music history. Each test is comprised of multiple choice questions and music listening examples. All tests are active at the start of the term, but each test has a strict due date after which it will no longer be available. This is to help keep you progressing through the course at a steady pace.

At an in-person class you must be present on one the day and time a test is given. Since all the tests in this course are available on the first day of class, and all test deadlines are clearly published ahead of time, there are no test makeups, extensions or extra-credit for missing a test deadline. Please record all test due dates in your calendar and avoid waiting until the last minute to take them in the event you run into an unforeseen issue. Missing a test will reduce your final grade by approximately 13%.

I recommend taking your tests in a campus computer lab if possible. If you experience a computer or internet problem there, staff can assist you or they may contact me. If you have an internet or computer issue while taking a test while off campus. I will be unable to resolve it.

With the exception of your short essays (below), all tests are to be taken without any type of assistance other than your memory. This includes, but is not limited to: using notes, books, websites, apps, Canvas modules, or collaborating with others.

#### Short Essays

Throughout this course you should be thinking about the question, "What is Music?" Your thoughts will develop and expand with each historic period and composer you will study. At the end of most modules you will be asked to write and upload a short, one to two-page essay answering this same question. Essays are due on the same days as the tests to which they correspond. As you write your essays you may use whatever sources you like except AI, however all quotes and borrowed ideas must be cited. Please click here for further essay instructions,
