Course Description: A study of the means, language, character, and function of music in various cultures, of the interrelationship of music and other arts, and of the thinking and values which are presented through music.

Course Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be expected to:

- 1. Identify the basic elements of music (melody, harmony, rhythm, form, etc.) of music as found in the music of non-Western cultures.
- 2. Describe and identify, through visual and aural examples, the instruments, genres, and styles of music presented through the semester.
- 3. Connect non-Western music to its purposes in the societies and cultures of the music's origin.
- 4. Connect non-Western music to the student's personal experiences.

 - Ebook with Total Access is sufficient.

My Own Musical Culture is an essay you will write that describes your own music culture and the ways you use music in your personal life.

For the <u>Concert Review</u>, you will write an essay over a concert of non-Western music that you choose from a prescribed list of videos in YouTube, connecting aspects of the concert to concepts in our course.

Attendance Policy: Full attendance and participation are expected in this course. Arrival after class has begun will count as a tardy. Three tardies will count as one unexcused absence. Arrival more than ten minutes late counts as an absence and impacts your attendance grade.

Additionally, avoidable distractions such as cell phone use/texting, eating food, outside work, and unnecessarily leaving the room during class time may result in a tardy or absence for the day, at the instructor's discretion.
