Demographic Profile

The population in the Longview Area was 522,026 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 247,407 with a participation rate of 60.4%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Longview Area, 23.1% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in the Longview Area is \$65,574 and the median house value is \$180,577.

About This Report

Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for the Longview Area was 4.5% as of November 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.0%. One year earlier, in November 2023, the unemployment rate in the Longview Area was 3.6%.




Unemployment Rate for Longview Area

About This Report

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Longview Area earned annual wages of \$54,849 as of 2024Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.3% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$72,405 in the nation as of 2024Q2.

About This Report

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 5.4% lower in Longview Area than the U.S. average.

About This Report

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Longview Area is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 28,383 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (23,365 workers) and Sales and Related Occupations (23,017). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (LQ = 1.38), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.23), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (1.17).

Occupation groups in the Longview Area with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$114,300), Management Occupations (\$110,600), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$96,700). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.2% among Legal Occupations to 6.8% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Longview Area is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+261 jobs) and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+249). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (4,230 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (3,157).



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Longview Area with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 4.31. This cluster employs 9,036 workers in the region with an average wage of \$109,079. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.3% per year over the next ten years.

About This Report

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Longview Area is projected to grow 0.8% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.1% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.1% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.1% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

About This Report

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2023, nominal GDP in the Longview Area expanded 4.5%. This follows growth of 18.6% in 2022. As of 2023, total GDP in the Longview Area was \$34,961,905,000.

Of the sectors in the Longview Area, Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2023, \$5,530,237,000 The next-largest contributions came from Manufacturing (\$5,007,377,000); Health Care and Social Assistance (\$4,233,789,000); and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$2,892,357,000).
