

Rains County Economic Overview 2025

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Demographic Profile

The population in Rains County, Texas was 12,257 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 5,265 with a participation rate of 51.8%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Rains County, Texas, 18.1% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Rains County, Texas is \$60,291 and the median house value is \$174,000.



Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Rains County, Texas was 3.3% as of November 2024. The regional unemployment rate was lower than the national rate of 4.0%. One year earlier, in November 2023, the unemployment rate in Rains County, Texas was 2.8%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through November 2024.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Rains County, Texas earned annual wages of \$40,817 as of 2024Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 6.2% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$72,405 in the nation as of 2024Q2.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2024Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2024Q2.

About This Report

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 7.8% lower in Rains County, Texas than the U.S. average.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Rains County, Texas is Management Occupations, employing 444 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (294 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (276). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 2.46), Construction and Extraction Occupations (2.18), and Management Occupations (1.90).

Occupation groups in Rains County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$100,600), Management Occupations (\$86,600), and Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$86,100). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Management Occupations to 5.1% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Rains County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +3.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Management Occupations (+7 jobs) and Construction and Extraction Occupations (+6). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (57 jobs) and Management Occupations (42).



About This Report

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Rains County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 9.75. This cluster employs 292 workers in the region with an average wage of \$14,780. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to expand in the region about 1.3% per year over the next ten years.



Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Rains County, Texas is projected to grow 1.6% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 2.0% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.8% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.8% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2023, nominal GDP in Rains County, Texas expanded 6.4%. This follows growth of 7.8% in 2022. As of 2023, total GDP in Rains County, Texas was \$266,734,000.



Gross Domestic Product data are provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, imputed by Chmura where necessary, updated through 2023.

Of the sectors in Rains County, Texas, Construction contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2023, \$43,763,000 The next-largest contributions came from Retail Trade (\$43,414,000); Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$22,036,000); and Educational Services (\$20,476,000).
