

# Titus County Economic Overview 2025

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## **Demographic Profile**

The population in Titus County, Texas was 31,301 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 13,924 with a participation rate of 59.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Titus County, Texas, 14.4% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Titus County, Texas is \$57,634 and the median house value is \$138,900.



## **Unemployment Rate**

The unemployment rate for Titus County, Texas was 4.4% as of November 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.0%. One year earlier, in November 2023, the unemployment rate in Titus County, Texas was 3.5%.




Unemployment Rate for Titus County, Texas

## Wage Trends

The average worker in Titus County, Texas earned annual wages of \$49,397 as of 2024Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 3.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$72,405 in the nation as of 2024Q2.

## **Cost of Living Index**

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 8.9% lower in Titus County, Texas than the U.S. average.

## **Occupation Snapshot**

The largest major occupation group in Titus County, Texas is Production Occupations, employing 4,085 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (1,763 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (1,680). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 4.02), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.32), and Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (1.20).

Occupation groups in Titus County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$111,500), Management Occupations (\$103,000), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$91,900). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.6% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 9.6% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Titus County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Production Occupations (+26 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (+15). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (474 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (258).



## **Industry Clusters**

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Titus County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Food Mfg. with a location quotient of 16.94. This cluster employs 3,772 workers in the region with an average wage of \$31,344. Employment in the Food Mfg. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.9% per year over the next ten years.

Industry Clusters for Titus County, Texas as of 2024Q2



## **Education Levels**

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Titus County, Texas is projected to grow 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.0% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.8% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.9% per year.




## Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

## **Gross Domestic Product**

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2023, nominal GDP in Titus County, Texas contracted 4.2%. This follows growth of 12.1% in 2022. As of 2023, total GDP in Titus County, Texas was \$1,996,238,000.

Of the sectors in Titus County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2023, \$883,348,000 The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$189,797,000); Retail Trade (\$153,482,000); and Educational Services (\$114,662,000).
