I. ATTENDANCE/WEEKEND MAKE-UP POLICY

The Executive MBA Healthcare Management program is a face-to-face weekend cohort model. It is expected that executive students are present face-to-face in COB 321 on the outlined weekends. In some cases, extenuating circumstances may warrant special accommodations to be made between the student and faculty member. Students are expected to contact and receive prior approval from the faculty member. Please refer to the specific course policy on attendance as outlined below.

My teaching philosophy emphasize multiple levels of interaction for each student with -material, self, fellow students and instructor, repetition, and positive leadership with multiple levels of engagement. Classes will be face-to-face (in person). Each week, students will interact with material (and self by reflecting) individually through graded assigned readings (article and/or chapter reviews), these are typically due on Thursday by 11:59 pm each week. Then, they will review the assignments in assigned groups first thing when we meet over the weekend for the first hour to discuss assignments and prepare a group presentation using PowerPoint (student-student interaction) and make class presentations in groups and joint class discussion facilitated by instructor (student-instructor interaction). Assignments will be graded individually and in groups. Final project will be presented at the last of class in groups as poster presentation. Thus, students are required to be present during each session, well prepared to contribute to group discussions and preparation for presentations, participate actively during group presentations and ask/answer questions during group presentations. No late work will be accepted and there is no opportunity to make up missed assignments. Since class participations contribute substantially to course grade, attendance in person is mandatory. If under extreme circumstances that the student must miss class, the instructor and the group members must be notified well in advance.

II. CONTENT

In a seminar format, the course will cover cultural competence, essential health services management concepts and practices; leadership, organizational design and change, managing the interface between healthcare organization and the environment and future trends in global health management.
