**Course Catalog Description:** A clinical skills course emphasizing the acquisition of practical therapeutic techniques through skill building sessions and modeling. Direct supervision using audio/video recordings will be provided. CR/NC only. Prerequisite: Grade of "B" or better in PSYC 5308, 5312, and 5328; and departmental consent.

This course is designed for advanced graduate students in clinical psychology. Students will learn more about themselves in relation to others, while learning basic clinical skills and beginning techniques for clinical interviewing, treatment planning, report writing, and individual therapy and practical consideration in their application. Familiarity with the DSM-5-TR is required. In addition to didactic learning, students will complete skill building sessions with a partner and digitally record their interviewing and psychotherapy techniques. You will receive supervision and feedback on your clinical skills throughout the course.
