Course Description (from catalog): Thorough explorations of topics of substantial scholarly interest in psychology. Prerequisite: Senior standing in psychology or consent of instructor.

Topic: International Psychology & Diversity

This course explores theoretical and practical issues of international psychology. These issues will be considered as they relate to human behavior. American psychologists generally concentrated on developments in American psychology. This occurs even though many innovations are international. This course is a discussion of the state of psychology outside of the USA.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate an ability to explain the practices (e.g. beliefs, values, perspectives, practices) of other cultures, nations, or regions.
- To learn how to read critically, analyze, and interpret international psychology and diversity research.
- Students will value difference among people and express an appreciation of cultures (language, art, music, religion, philosophy, family and community structures, and material culture).

Required Apps:

To avoid possible confusion and getting lost while abroad, it will be required that students download **CityMaps2Go** app to their smart phone (if they have a smart phone). If you do not own a smart phone, you will be paired with someone in the course that has one. This app costs \$20 to download and is good "for life." You will be instructed to download the city map of London before your flight abroad. Once in London, you can view where you are in the city without internet or data usage.

- *Reading Quizzes:* Students will be quizzed on each new reading before class discussion. Quizzes may be multiple-choice questions, short answer, or short essay.
- *Presentation:* During the last class period in Tyler, students will be asked to give a 15 minute presentation on a famous Brit and their contribution to British culture. More information on this presentation will be posted on canvas.
- Attendance/Participation: Attendance in this class is not only mandatory but also very important. Your contributions will be invaluable and you need to be here every day. Each absence will result in a full letter-grade reduction (10%) of your grade. Obviously, this is a serious matter, so try to plan. Unquestioned absences include sickness, job interviews, personal matters, etc. Therefore, if you anticipate having to miss class at any point, please plan accordingly. If a University activity will cause you to miss more than two classes, please see your instructor. Students who anticipate being absent from class due to a religious observance are requested to inform me before the class begins. - *Travel Journal*: While participating in the travel study portion of the class, students will keep a journal. This journal will contain responses to prompts that the instructor gives throughout the course. You will turn in your journal once you return to the United States or at the concluding dinner in England.
