

AMA Citation Style Guide (American Medical Association, 11th Edition)

Overview: AMA style is used in medicine and health sciences, emphasizing clarity and brevity.

In-Text Citations:

- Superscript numbers appear in the order cited.
Example: The treatment showed significant improvement.¹
- For multiple citations, separate numbers with commas.
Example: Several studies support this finding.^{1,2,3}

References Section:

- **Order:** Numbered as they appear in the text.
- **Journal Article:** Smith J, Brown M. Advances in cancer treatment. *J Clin Oncol.* 2020;38(5):123-130. doi:10.1200/JCO.19.03023.
- **Book:** Doe J, ed. *Comprehensive Guide to Clinical Research.* 2nd ed. Medical Press; 2019.
- **Website:** American Medical Association. Guideline for Opioid Use. Published October 15, 2021. Accessed January 5, 2022. <https://www.ama-assn.org/delivering-care/opioid-task-force>.

Formatting Basics:

- **Font & Spacing:** Times New Roman, 12 pt; single-space entries; double-space between entries.
- **Titles:** Abbreviate journal names (per PubMed); capitalize only the first word of article titles and proper nouns.
