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Course Description: It is the purpose of this course to introduce students to the field of athletic training and to develop competencies pertaining to the recognition, management, and prevention sports related injuries, trauma and emergencies. Students will also develop competency and familiarity with the legal/ethical responsibilities involved.

Outcomes: Upon completion of the course, the student shall be able to:

- 1. Identify and discuss the types of therapeutic modalities commonly used in the athletic training clinic.
- 2. Discuss any legal implications of using certain therapeutic modalities without written orders from a prescribing physician.
- 3. Discuss the proper time during the healing phase to use certain therapeutic modalities.
- 4. Apply evidence based practice concepts in the selection and utilization of therapeutic modalities.
- 5. Properly apply therapeutic modalities to a fellow classmate or model in a simulated clinical setting.

Throughout the course, there will be quizzes designed to assess retention in between tests. These quizzes will only cover the material discussed in the previous class, and will feature 5 short answer questions worth 2 points a piece.

Journal Club:

Students will be required to obtain a peer reviewed journal article over the following topics for class.

- Cryotherapy/Thermotherapy
- Electrotherapy
- Therapeutic Ultrasound
- Traction/Massage/Compression
- Cupping/IASTM/Kinesiotaping/Acupuncture

Students will take place in an online discussion forum on Canvas with instructions provided for each discussion. If students have an article that is the same as a fellow student, each student using that article will share the cumulative grade (example: 4 students who earn an average of 20 points would get 5 points a piece).

Exams:

There will be three exams throughout the course to assess retention of the course material. The exams will include multiple choice, true false, matching, and short answer questions.

Final Exam:

This course will feature a comprehensive final exam in the same format as the previous described exam.

Exam Policy:

In the interest of fairness to all students, examinations are to be taken during their scheduled time. Any student who anticipates missing an examination is responsible for making arrangements to take their exam prior to the absence. Exams may be taken after the scheduled date only in the event of an illness (doctor's note is required) or a personal or family emergency.

Late Work:

All assignments are expected to be turned in as scheduled in the course syllabus. For each day that an assignment is late, the grade for that assignment will be decreased by 10%.
