Scientific and Medical Terminology E-Textbook:

This course material is designed for degree seeking students at the University of Texas at Tyler and is a student centered <u>online</u> computer based classroom course. The tutorial format has an 800 page online printable textbook containing interactive audio-visual lecture pages that prepare each student for the 1000 self-testing flashcards and the 800 multiple choice self-test questions. (However, it is not necessary to print the text as it will be available to you at all times via the program.) These activities must be completed in full before you can take the final exam online in chapter 16. The final exam is worth 50% of the final grade and your results are automatically graded and sent to you and your instructor along with your completed summary sheet. Therefore, going into the final exam, you will have already completed

every other portion of the graded work. You will not be able to open or complete the final exam without the other work being accomplished.

The course is designed to stay on a strict and scheduled pace. DO NOT let yourself fall behind. Nonetheless, if you are an overachiever you can surely finish the course work much earlier...including the final exam. Working ahead is encouraged. If you fall behind, and I will remind you if I see you doing so, it will become very difficult to catch and keep up.
