Course Description: This course focuses on the etiology, pathophysiology, and clinical presentation of selected human diseases

across the life span.

Prerequisites: School of Nursing Advisor Approval

Corequisites: n/a

Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Integrate knowledge from the biological sciences into the study of the pathophysiology of human diseases.
- 2. Compare the pathologic origins of selected disease processes at the cellular and systemic levels.
- 3. Correlate the effects of internal and external environmental risk factors with disease development and progression.
- 4. Discuss the influence of genetic, ethnic, and cultural factors on health promotion and disease prevention, progression, and treatment.
- 5. Explain the effects of compensatory body mechanisms in response to major alterations in physiology.
- 6. Relate diagnostic test findings to both objective and subjective disease symptoms.
- 7. Employ select nursing and biomedical research studies in the application of pathophysiologic principles to nursing practice.
- 8. Discuss the impact of the current body of knowledge in pathophysiology on evidence-based nursing practice.

Final course grades less than 70 are not rounded up.

Once the student has achieved a simple exam average of 70% or higher, course grades will be determined based on the weighted calculation of exams and other required course work. Students who do not attain a simple exam grade average of at least 70% will not receive credit for other graded course work, and the final course grade will be based on the simple average of the course exams only.

Completion of NURS 3303 is based on satisfactory attainment of meeting the course objectives and a passing exam average of at least 70%.

Graded Course Requirements Information:

Exams: A total of 5 exams will be given on campus as indicated on the Course Schedule. Each exam will be worth 100 points. Failure to take an exam as scheduled will result in a grade of 0 for the exam. In the event of illness or emergency, the student should contact faculty. Make-up for a missed exam is at the instructor's discretion.

Quizzes: Online quizzes are taken in Canvas as indicated on the Course Schedule. Each quiz will be worth 100 points. Quizzes will open and close in accordance with the course schedule (see course schedule). Failure to complete the quiz within this time frame will result in a grade of 0 for the quiz. It is recommended that the student take the quizzes on campus or on a laptop to avoid technical difficulties. The UTT IT department recommends using Firefox or Chrome browsers for Canvas. Class notes and textbooks may be used for the weekly online quizzes. Quiz grades will be calculated into the course final grade only after a simple average of 70% is attained on exams.

Davis Advantage Interactive Assignments: Weekly interactive learning activities are assigned for each module. The activities are accessed through Canvas assignments. The interactive activity grade is calculated as the percent of activity completion. <u>Interactive activity assignment grades will be</u> calculated into the course final grade only after a simple average of 70% is attained on exams.

University Policies and Information

Withdrawing from Class: Students are allowed to withdraw (drop) this course through the University's withdrawal portal. Texas law prohibits students who began college for the first time in Fall 2007 or thereafter from dropping more than six courses during their entire undergraduate career. This includes courses dropped at other 2-year or 4-year Texas public colleges and universities. Make sure to consider the impact withdrawing from this class has on your academic progress as well as the financial implications. We encourage you to consult your advisor(s) and financial aid for additional guidance. CAUTION #1: Withdrawing before census day does not mean you get a full refund. Please see the Tuition and Fee Refund Schedule. CAUTION #2: All international students must check with the Office of International Programs before withdrawing. All international students are required to enroll full-time for fall and spring terms.

Final Exam Policy: Final examinations are administered as scheduled. If unusual circumstances require that special arrangements be made for an individual student or class, the dean of the appropriate college, after consultation with the faculty member involved, may authorize an exception to the schedule. Faculty members are required to maintain student final examination papers for a minimum of three months following the examination date.

Incomplete Grade Policy: If a student, because of extenuating circumstances, is unable to complete all of the requirements for a course by the end of the semester, then the instructor may recommend an Incomplete (I) for the course. The "I" may be assigned in lieu of a grade only when all of the following conditions are met: (a) the student has been making satisfactory progress in the course; (b) the student is unable to complete all course work or final exam due to unusual circumstances that are beyond personal control and are acceptable to the instructor, and (c) the student presents these reasons prior to the time that the final grade roster is due. The semester credit hours for an Incomplete will not be used to calculate the grade point average for a student.

The student and the instructor must submit an Incomplete Form detailing the work required and the time by which the work must be completed to their respective department chair or college dean for approval. The time limit established must not exceed one year. Should the student fail to complete all of the work for the course within the time limit, then the instructor may assign zeros to the unfinished work, compute the course average for the student, and assign the appropriate grade. If a grade has not been assigned within one year, then the Incomplete will be changed to an F or NC if the course was originally taken under the CR/NC grading basis.

Grade Appeal Policy: UT Tyler's Grade Appeal policy requires the completion of a Grade Appeal form for this action to take place. The grade appeal begins with the instructor of your course. If you do not agree with the decision of the instructor, you may then move your appeal to the department chair/school director for that course. If you are still dissatisfied with the decision of the chair/director, you may move the appeal to the dean of the college offering that course, who has the final decision. Grade appeals must be initiated within sixty (60) days from the date of receiving the final course grade. The grade Appeal form is found on the <u>Registrar's Form Library.</u>
