Course Description: This course explores evidence-based pharmacotherapeutic nursing interventions to improve patient care. Emphasis is on principles of safe medication administration and patient education. Community, ethical/legal and cultural considerations are explored.

Prerequisites: Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program and NURS 3303.

Graded Course Requirements Information:

ATI Module Assignments: Each week prior to lecture, you are required to review the applicable ATI online course module and submit a report demonstrating that you have completed the module quiz.

Pharm Phamily Project: Using Studio in Canvas, you will record a power point presentation to share with the class covering the content of one drug of your selection. You will also be responsible for reviewing and commenting on others' videos utilizing the discussion board.

ATI Testing Policy

ATI Pharmacology Practice A and Practice B: These two practice tests will be completed at home during a specified week designated by course faculty. During that same week you will be required to complete all remediations for the practice tests. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero for the assignment.

ATI Pharmacology Proctored Test: This test will be administered in a proctored exam environment (computer lab) on campus. You will receive a Raw Score from this test. Your ATI Raw Score is weighted based on the rubric below. Similar to the practice tests, you will be given

1 week to complete all remediations for the proctored test. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero for the assignment.

ATI Focused Review: After completion of the practice A and B tests and proctored test, ATI will suggest a Focused Review for remediation. Focused Review is required for obtaining the percentage points listed below on the rubric. If the focused review hours, templates, and applicable quizzes are not completed by the due date, the grade entered for the practice or proctored exam will be an automatic zero.

Withdrawing from Class: Students are allowed to withdraw (drop) this course through the University's withdrawal portal. Texas law prohibits students who began college for the first time in Fall 2007 or thereafter from dropping more than six courses during their entire undergraduate career. This includes courses dropped at other 2-year or 4-year Texas public colleges and universities. Make sure to consider the impact withdrawing from this class has on your academic progress as well as the financial implications. Final Exam Policy: Final examinations are administered as scheduled. If unusual circumstances require that special arrangements be made for an individual student or class, the dean of the appropriate college, after consultation with the faculty member involved, may authorize an exception to the schedule. Faculty members are required to maintain student final examination papers for a minimum of three months following the examination date.

Incomplete Grade Policy: If a student, because of extenuating circumstances, is unable to complete all of the requirements for a course by the end of the semester, then the instructor may recommend an Incomplete (I) for the course. The "I" may be assigned in lieu of a grade only when all of the following conditions are met: (a) the student has been making satisfactory progress in the course; (b) the student is unable to complete all course work or final exam due to unusual circumstances that are beyond personal control and are acceptable to the instructor, and (c) the student presents these reasons prior to the time that the final grade roster is due. The semester credit hours for an Incomplete will not be used to calculate the grade point average for a student.

The student and the instructor must submit an Incomplete Form detailing the work required and the time by which the work must be completed to their respective department chair or college dean for approval. The time limit established must not exceed one year. Should the student fail to complete all of the work for the course within the time limit, then the instructor may assign zeros to the unfinished work, compute the course average for the student, and assign the appropriate grade. If a grade has not been assigned within one year, then the Incomplete will be changed to an F or NC if the course was originally taken under the CR/NC grading basis.

Grade Appeal Policy: UT Tyler's Grade Appeal policy requires the completion of a Grade Appeal form for this action to take place. The grade appeal begins with the instructor of your course. If you do not agree with the decision of the instructor, you may then move your appeal to the department chair/school director for that course. If you are still dissatisfied with the decision of

the chair/director, you may move the appeal to the dean of the college offering that course, who has the final decision. Grade appeals must be initiated within sixty (60) days from the date of receiving the final course grade. The grade Appeal form is found on the <u>Registrar's Form Library</u>.
