**Course Description:** In this course, students will continue to apply the concepts of evidence-based practice (EBP) to transform their identified practice problem into a fully developed DNP scholarly project. Activities include all phases of the project planning process.

Prerequisites: NURS 6358 or permission from DNP director

**Corequisites:** NURS 6371
