Course Overview

NURS 6112 Roles & Foundational Concepts for the AGACNP focuses on adult and gerontological concepts for the adult-gerontology acute care nurse practitioner (AGACNP) role in providing safe, quality care to diverse populations. Emphasis will be placed on the role and scope of practice of the AGACNP in caring for acutely ill adults, often with complex chronic medical conditions, across the adult-geriatric continuum. Whether you enjoy research and teaching or hospital management and collaboration, there is a place for each one of us at the rounding table.

During our seven weeks together, you will interview both an APRN and a case manager in an acute care setting to gain insight into the multidisciplinary team. We will discuss some current hot topics in weekly discussion boards to stimulate your growth into the AGACNP role. You will develop your own study plan to obtain your AGACNP certification. Yes, you WILL pass the exam and become a valued member of the acute care team!

- Understand the Consensus Model for APRN Regulation and the four components of licensure, accreditation, certification, and education.
- Examine the AGACNP role in clinical decision-making while focusing on health promotion and disease prevention in the adult/geriatric acute care population.
- Integrate theoretical frameworks and evidence-based data to enhance practitioner management of acutely/chronically ill adult/geriatric patients.
- Demonstrate a contribution to holistic, culturally, and ethically sensitive healthcare for clients and families of the acutely/chronically ill adult/geriatric patient.
- Contribute to a culture of provider and work environment safety and mutual respect including self-respect.
- Collaborate effectively with members of the healthcare delivery system to assist with health promotion and chronic disease management for the individual and community-at-large.
- Analyze and evaluate factors such as healthcare access barriers, costs, and safety in the care of the acutely/chronically ill adult and geriatric patient.
- Demonstrate the utilization of information technology to enhance healthcare processes and positively influence patient outcomes.

Course Structure

This course is structured as an online self-paced learning environment. However, this course has four (4) live sessions via ZOOM that are designed as question-and-answer (Q&A) sessions to review course material and assignments. Attendance is highly recommended; however, they will be recorded and available for students who cannot attend. This does not require you to be in a specific location to participate; however, you must have access to a full-screen computer or tablet for each live session. (If you use a tablet for the live session, you must be comfortable typing responses on it.) The online nature of this class will push you to take an active role in the learning process. You will do this by engaging and collaborating with other students and the instructor on a regular basis both, in live sessions, as well as through group work and activities.

Tips for Success in this Course

- 1. **Participate.** I invite you to engage deeply, ask questions, and talk about the course content with your classmates. You can learn a great deal from discussing ideas and perspectives with your peers and professor. Participation can also help you articulate your thoughts and develop critical thinking skills.
- 2. **Manage your time.** I get it—students usually juggle a lot, and I know you've got commitments beyond this class. Still, doing your best often means carving out enough dedicated time for coursework. Try scheduling specific blocks of time and ensure you have enough room to finish assignments, allowing extra space for any tech issues that might pop up.
- 3. **Login regularly.** I recommend that you log in to Canvas several times a week to view announcements, discussion posts and replies to your posts.
- 4. **Do not fall behind.** This class moves at a quick pace and each week builds on the previous class content. If you feel you are starting to fall behind, check in with the instructor as soon as possible so we can troubleshoot together. It will be hard to keep up with the course content if you fall behind in the pre-work or post-work.
- 5. **Use Canvas notification settings.** Pro Tip! Canvas can ensure you receive timely notifications in your email or via text. Be sure to enable notifications to be sent instantly or daily. (Canvas Notification Guide)
- 6. **Ask for help if needed.** If you are struggling with a course concept, reach out to me and your classmates for support.

Participation & Engagement

• Attendance at the AGACNP New Student Orientation - Participation is pass/fail. If a student cannot participate, faculty must approve an alternative assignment for completion grade.

Interviews – Paper Submissions

- Collaboration Interview with an Acute Care case manager or social worker Individual Paper: Select and interview a case manager or social worker in the acute care setting. Address questions posed in the assignment regarding barriers to access to care, costs, and safety for patients requiring acute care and management of chronic diseases. Review transition of care videos by Epsin et al. (nd) under support materials and compare similar transition multidisciplinary team dynamics with the case manager/SW. Utilize APA7 format and how to cite personal communications. The paper will be graded based on the provided rubric and will be worth 10% of the overall grade.
- Role Transition Interview with an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Individual Paper: Select and
 interview an advanced practice registered nurse utilizing the interview questionnaire found in the Joel
 textbook APN: Essentials for Role Development (refer to online text Box 3.3 on page 38 and page 194 for
 additional questions). Summarize the results of your interview and upload to the assignment by the due
 date. Utilize APA7 and how to cite personal communications. The paper will be graded based on the
 provided rubric and will be worth 10% of the overall grade.

attempts available with answer rationale and is a free sample test resource for potential candidates. Upload confirmation of participation which is worth 10% of the overall grade.

Weekly Discussion Board Posts

- Six discussion board posts associated with a corresponding module topic and are based on the assigned readings and media.
- The initial response to the module discussion is due by midnight on the Wednesday of the module week. The maximum word count is 500 and responses should be uploaded in APA7 format (no title page necessary) and have two references noted. Two replies to other students' posts for the module are due by Sunday at midnight of the module week and have a maximum word count of 250 and should include one reference.
- These discussion board posts will be worth 5 points each (3 for initial post and 1 for each reply).
- Combined all discussion board assignments will be worth 30% of the overall course grade.

Exams

- Two Exams each covering three modules (#1: modules 1-3 and #2: modules 4-6)
- Exams are 25 multiple-choice questions
- Students must obtain an average grade of 80 on exams to pass the course
- Each exam is worth 20% and combined are weighted as 40% of the final grade
