Course Description: This course is focused on the financial and business management concepts needed by DNP-prepared nurses. The concepts of cost-effective, accessible, and equitable resources are addressed. The internal and external factors that drive healthcare costs and reimbursement will be analyzed.

Prerequisites: NURS 6317, NURS 6371 or permission of DNP director

Discussions (35%): Discussion boards are an opportunity for you to communicate asynchronously with your classmates and faculty as you apply the content in the course modules. You will respond to a forum topic by creating a thread. Responses to peers using the RISE Model format to frame actionable feedback are required for discussion boards and case studies.

Assignments (30%): Assignments are an opportunity for you to apply what you have learned about financial and business management. For one short paper, you will describe the budget and resources needed for a program or project. For the other short paper, you will assess and discuss the costs and benefits of a new healthcare technology with applications for nurses in healthcare settings.
