Course Description: This course explores evidence-based pharmacotherapeutic nursing interventions to improve patient care. Emphasis is on principles of safe medication administration and patient education. Community, ethical/legal and cultural considerations are explored.

Prerequisites: Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program and NURS 3303.

Graded Course Requirements Information:

ATI Module Assignments: Each week prior to lecture, you are required to review the applicable ATI online course module and submit a report demonstrating that you have completed the module quiz.

Pharm Phamily Project: Using Studio in Canvas, you will record a power point presentation to share with the class covering the content of one drug of your selection. You will also be responsible for reviewing and commenting on others' videos utilizing the discussion board.

Section 1: ATI Practice Assessment A & B

These two practice tests will be completed at home during a specified week designated by course faculty. During that same week you will be required to complete all remediations for the practice tests. Based on the exam score, the 6 active learning templates (ALTs) are to be completed plus a quiz is required (75 and below requires two quizzes). All components: Assessment Score, ALTs, and exam score report are all uploaded into the designated assignment tab in the course canvas. Custom quizzes must be 80% or greater to be accepted. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero.

Each exam and remediation are worth 20 points. No partial points are awarded.

Section 2: ATI Proctored Assessment

The Proctored Assessment is a test that will be administered in a proctored exam environment (computer lab) on campus. The Level and remediation are determined by the proctored assessment score from the exam. Your ATI Raw Score is weighted based on the rubric below.

Similar to the practice tests, you will be given 1 week to complete all remediations for the proctored test. All remediation requirements must be uploaded to the canvas assignment tab by the required course due date to receive the allotted points. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero for the assignment. No partial points are awarded.

No show/no call for the assigned proctored exam may result in zero points.

Section 3: ATI Proctored Retake Assessment

The Proctored Retake Assessment is not required for Level 3. Level 1 or Below Level 1 is required to retake the exam as scheduled by each course. 10 additional point for each additional level improved for the retake assessment may be obtained if the student scores at the next level.

i.e., Below Level 1 scores at Level 1 or higher. Level 2 MAY retake for a higher score to be achieved.

No additional remediation is required after the retaken assessment is completed.
