APEA QBANK (required): Q Bank is a test bank for advanced practice nurses. All nurse practitioners will be using Q Bank in Advanced Pathophysiology, Advanced Health Assessment and Advanced Pharmacology. Instructions to purchase a Q Bank package will be given to student on the first day of class. Purchase of APEA QBANK is student responsibility

UpToDate (Recommended): You will get this free through the school and instructions on how to get this will be discussed the first day of class. It is a great resource for drugs, labs, and disease processes.

Required Course Technology

ProctorUAuto and *ProctorU Live* are virtual proctoring services that will be used for all exams. This technology will be paid for by UT Tyler but you must register to get a testing time in the testing window.

Specifically, Exams 1-4 will use ProctorU Auto and the Final Exam will use ProctorU Live. There is no additional cost for proctoring with ProctorU. The only time you may be charged a fee is if you register LATE for scheduling the Final Exam through ProctorU Live. ProctorU Live requires each student to schedule within 72 hours prior to the Final Exam. You will need to create a ProctorU account and install the ProctorU extension before attempting any exam. To create a ProctorU account, follow the ProctorU tool within Canvas.

Please make sure you are using the current version of **Chrome** download the ProctorU extension available at http://bit.ly/proctoruchrome or https://www.proctoru.com/firefox.

To use ProctorU, you will need the following:

- High-speed Internet connection- not dial up.
- Webcam and microphone (internal or external)
- Windows, Mac, or Chrome Operating System
- Up-to-date Chrome browser and ProctorU extension installed
- Valid photo ID
- Quiet environment to take your exam
- A lamp by the side of your monitor for good lighting.

Students are required to achieve an average of 80% (B) to complete the course successfully.

EXAMS: 75% of course grade:

There will be five (5) exams worth 75% of your total grade. Each exam is worth 15% of your total course grade. The exams will consist of multiple-choice questions. The exams will be timed. Dates for exams are listed on course calendar that can be found in the "Getting Started" Module. Exam dates/times are set. You will have 90 minutes to complete the exam. EXAMS 1-4 (unit specific) will consist of 50 multiple choice questions. EXAM 5 (APEA QBANK comprehensive final) will consist of 75 multiple choice questions.

You must use ProctorU Auto for your online testing proctor-Unit exams 1-4 and ProctorU Live for final APEA comprehensive exam. Sign up and/or login instructions/help can be found in Canvas under "Getting Started" Module. APEA QBANK Access is required for final comprehensive exam.

QUIZZES (QBank): 25% of overall grade. Each quiz will have unit specific quizzes via APEA QBANK.

APEA Q bank Categories: Cardiology, Dermatology, Endocrine, Gastrointestinal, Hematology, Men Health, Women's Health, Neurology, Orthopedics, Psychiatry, Respiratory, Sexually Transmitted Infections, Urology, ENT, Pregnancy

APEA quizzes are unit specific, and categories will be combined per each unit with a total of 15 quizzes throughout the semester). Multiple attempts may occur prior to due date. Grading will be based on timely submission. A minimum grade of 80% is required to submit your quiz in canvas. Purchase of 3-month access to APEA QBANK is required (see electronic subscriptions above.)
