Course Description: This course will explore major world cultures and concepts of spirituality. Emphasis will be on the healthcare team and interaction with patients/clients.

Prerequisites: none

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. **Patient-Centered Care:** Recognize individual preferences, values, and needs; anticipate the uniqueness of all individuals, families, and populations; and incorporate the patient/family/population in the plan and implementation of care.
2. **Evidence Based Practice:** Synthesize and apply evidence, along with clinical expertise and patient values, to improve patient outcomes related to cultural and spiritual values.
3. **Teamwork and Collaboration:** Function effectively in nursing and interprofessional teams and foster communication, mutual respect, and shared decision-making to achieve quality patient care.
4. **Wellness and Prevention:** Assess health and wellness in individuals, families, groups, communities, and populations to promote health outcomes.

Required Textbooks and Readings: There are no required texts, and online resources will be provided.

Computer Requirements: Access to a current, working computer or laptop with internet access using Firefox or Chrome browser is required for this internet-based course. The Canvas learning system works best using Firefox or Chrome browsers. It is essential to have access to a reliable PC/laptop and internet access for this course.

Technical resources: Laptops/electronic devices are required for assignments, discussions, and quizzes. We use Microsoft Office Products (Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, etc.)

You may, however, use an AI Writing Assistant (like Grammarly) **to help check for spelling, grammatical errors, and best word choice once your document is written.** If you do use a tool like Grammarly for edits and fine-tuning, you **MUST** acknowledge this in your reference section and indicate what assistance was given. Examples will be provided in the course.

Course orientation will be recorded to Studio video and placed in the course.

Introduction and Surveys: These assignments include an individual presentation to the class and completing several surveys related to online learning and culture and spirituality topics.

Mastery Quizzes of multiple choice, matching, and true false questions are included for modules 1 and 2 and cover the main points of the modules.

Two reflections for modules 1 and 2 are included as students reflect on their learning.

The Love, Joy, Peace framework will be addressed via video and follow up with a reflection activity.

Three case studies are included where students apply the content in each of the modules. An alternative assignment will be developing an educational product that could be used in a clinical setting, like a brochure, infographic, or handout with tips on culture and/or spirituality in patient care.

A pre-recorded interdisciplinary panel discussion on Zoom will be available for students to view. Students are required to submit an example question to be asked of a panel in the future. Students will then to write a reflection of the recorded panel discussion.

A summary reflection assignment is required to reflect on the main elements of the course.
