Specific guidelines and grading criteria for all assignments are in the Modules. Final grades for the course will be determined based upon the following point assignments:

Grades will not be rounded when calculating the average (79.5 is not rounded to 80, and 89.5 is not rounded to 90). Students are required to achieve an average of 80% (B) to complete the course successfully. **Assignments cannot be resubmitted to be regraded.**

When using AI tools for assignments, add an appendix showing (a) the entire exchange (e.g., prompts used), highlighting the most relevant sections; (b) a description of precisely which AI tools were used, (c) an explanation of how the AI tools were used (e.g. to generate ideas, elements of text, etc.); and (d) an account of why AI tools were used (e.g. to save time, to surmount writer's block, to stimulate thinking, to experiment for fun, etc.). Students shall not use AI tools during in-class examinations or assignments unless explicitly permitted and instructed to do so.

Apply course content by communicating asynchronously with classmates and faculty.

DNP Leadership Development (40%):

Articulate your thoughts about your development as a leader and change agent including the development of your leadership skills and style and the influence of your strengths and emotional intelligence; integration of diversity, equity, and inclusion as core to your professional identity; and how you will evaluate the business, economic, and financial management principles that influence the ongoing operation and sustainability of practice change or quality improvement initiatives within healthcare organizations.

Participation (10%):
