Course Description: This WEB based course for registered nurses broadens existing knowledge of the discipline of nursing based on a liberal education in the arts and sciences. Emphasis is on professional role expansion through exploration of contemporary nursing issues.

Prerequisites: Pre-Requisite: Admission to the RN-BSN Track. Special permission required from the School of Nursing to take out of sequence. May take course prior to completing State Boards (NLCEX).

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Professionalism:

- a. Integrate a foundation from the arts and sciences into professional nursing knowledge.
- b. Analyze the roles of the professional nurse in a complex and changing healthcare environment.
- 2. Patient-Centered Care: Integrate skill, knowledge, and attitudes into holistic, evidence based professional nursing care.
- 3. **Evidence-Based Practice (EBP)**: Explain the use of evidence-based research for best practices.
- 4. **Informatics & Technology**: Utilize information from available databases for professional writing that addresses nursing practice.
- Quality Improvement: Demonstrate knowledge of healthcare policy, finance, and regulatory environments.

- 6. **Teamwork and Collaboration**: Analyze the role of nurse related to interpersonal care through inter and intra professional collaboration.
- 7. **Wellness and Prevention**: Relate concepts of health promotion maintenance, restoration, and disease prevention to professional practice.
- 8. **Leadership**: Explain how historical, ethical, and legal foundations of nursing as well as the core values of nursing enhance professionalism.
- 9. **Safety**: Integrate skill, knowledge, and attitudes into holistic, evidence based professional nursing care.
- 10. **Strengths**: Measure how strengths (signature talent themes) influence the role of the student nurse and clinical decision-making.

Special Course Notes:

Strengths Exercise Paper (15%) (100 pts.)	Writing the Strengths Exercise Paper will a.) require you to complete a strengths assessment and b.) identify your top 5 strengths. Taking this new knowledge you will apply this new knowledge to your nursing practice.
Ethics and Workplace Incivility Paper (15%) (100 pts.)	Writing the Ethics and Workplace civility paper consists of reviewing the American Nursing Association Code of Ethics and apply to a workplace situation. In addition, identify an ethical dilemma and take into consideration the nurses role as an advocate to avoid future violations.
Philosophy Statement (15%) (100 pts.)	Writing the Philosophy paper consists of a.) Reviewing the four concepts that have been identified as the metaparadigm of nursing and b.) Describing your ideas about each metaparadigm. Taking into consideration all you have learned

about the role of the professional nurse and actions professional nurses incorporate into their
practice to create your own
personal nursing philosophy.
