President Updates - President Calhoun

Dr. Wahlrad – President Calhoun isn't here today – there are no updates.

Provost Updates – Dr. Amir Mirmiran

- Summer enrollment is up we are 10% up over last year.
 - Graduate level seems to be 40% of our enrollment is coming on the graduate side.
- We got some updates from David regarding FASFA with all issues that we have. We are hopeful fall will be another great enrollment for:
 - Incoming Freshmen
 - Incoming transfer students
 - Renewing
 - Hopefully with retention we will avoid summer melt and have a good number of students coming back this summer.
- April is last month of academic year. Month we celebrate research and scholarship.
 - o Lyceum April 26th
 - o Graduate School three-minute thesis April 9th
 - Celebration of Scholarship Dean of Libraries not enough RSVPs, cancel luncheon.
 - Magazine will go out to capture work done by faculty on research and scholarship.
 - East Texas Research Conference (April 12th)
 - First time partnership with the Chamber of Commerce.

- First meeting with AI Artificial Intelligence Academic Committee
 - First meeting with committee rep from each college and school.
 - Learned a lot about type of work faculty are using AI. Four things:
 - Integrity and Ethics
 - Come up with a policy that needs to be incorporated in the syllabus.
 - Create a resource center Canvas and website all information needed in terms of resources available and initiatives we are doing.
 - Marketing and Office of Digital Learning
 - Training for faculty and students.
 - CETL
 - Campus-wide training as part of orientation and onboarding
 - What's appropriate and what's not?
 - Add to courses help students learn what's appropriate and what's not.
 - Process needing to take to create new courses and how to integrate AI into existing courses.
 - Great initiatives in HRD, and English department, and Lit. and Lang, and nursing department.
 - There are changes daily need to stay up on it. This is new future of higher education.

Dr. Wahlrab - Concern of catching students who are using AI – how do I find out if students are using AI in a way they shouldn't be?

Dr. Mirmiran – this is part of what the group will be doing.

- Yesterday was the site visit from the Coordinating Board for our PhD in Integrated Biomedical Sciences.
 - Dr. Pierre Nuenchwanders works very hard.
 - Successful day.
 - Hopefully it will start next year.
- Legislative hearings will start.
 - Amir, Stephanie, myself, and Dr. Calhoun will be working on legislative priorities for the university will be communicating those as we formulate a plan.

Mr. Robert Cromley – Executive Director for Emergency Management and Safety

• Fall parking and updates about what we are doing.

- Put in a new parking lot adding back Lot 4 by the bell tower a little over 100 spaces for faculty and staff only.
- Provost and committee working on class times and looking at helping that manage parking – class times and number of students on campus at any given time.
 - Every day is a busy day on campus 9:00 up until at least noon potentially 2000 cars on campus.
 - We have 2,039 parking spaces on campus for everybody.
 Students, faculty, staff, and whoever is here.
 - Work with event staff for events on campus severely impacts parking for everyone.
 - Maybe schedule those better.
- Lot 6 lot 6 extension make it larger 21 spaces get in another 60 spaces
 to make it 80 and make it a two-way street.
 - Late fall, early next year project.
- Increase in students and enrollment makes it difficult for students on campus and resident hall.
 - Liberty Victory Village will be changes to a resident permit cannot park on campus.
- Question from audience asked about shuttle service.
 - Shuttle service hasn't generally been very productive.
 - 5 riders in 4 weeks not productive enough for what it costs.
 - Nursing school renovation will be completed this summer.
 - Parking will come back which will help.
- Question from audience about opinion on parking enforcement.
 - You will not have a hangtag anymore.
 - License plate recognition tied to permit.
 - Will be able to recognize quicker camera will be able to read every license plate easier for attendants to find.
 - Make sure we get collection of fines.
 - Holds on transcripts.
 - Can't buy permit with outstanding citations.
 - Little more enforcement on frequent offenders.
 - \$250 or more we will be booting vehicles.
 - About 950 citations and another 400 or so in warning citations.
- Parking coordinator at One-Stop Shop.
- Please contact our parking coordinator or contact my office. Go to the website or the parking portal for information.
- One event coming up we do every year or twice a year bring food for the food pantry, you can have a citation waived if you bring at least 5 items. The citation has to be less than \$100.
- New signage for reserved parking this year.
 - Not painting curbs anymore.
 - If you have a reserved space, you'll have a number and can park there.

- Going to be restriping this summer and repainting pavement that is reserved to make it clearer.
- Restriping lot 8 and others.

Lisa Bush - Associate VP of Research Administration

- Used to lead human research protections program for both campuses and the hospital system.
- Lots of changes on the back side more than what you will see on the front side.
 - We want to make sure we maintain our daily operations when servicing everyone.
