12:30 Welcome and Call to Order, Dr. Josh Banta

 Introduction and agenda – passionate about leveraging strengths across our wide array of academic disciplines (looking for commonality); walkability and connectivity between campuses

12:32 Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes, Dr. Dixie Rose

- Minutes were approved
- Reminder to sign in either on the sign in sheets or in the chat on zoom

12:35 President Updates, Dr. Julie Philley

- Thankful for seamless transition with leadership of Senate
- Beginning discussions for legislative asks: funding for rehabilitation science expanding OT, considering PT, continuing ST, movement disorders; revitalization of buildings on campus
- 10,541 enrollment couldn't do this without faculty and the best enrollment management team; highest percent increase in UT System
- Branding when to use athletic and when to use academic; questions will be answered as they come up and processes in development; looking for ways to engage students on campus (student life) and how to devote resources to there
- Recent dean changes will be deferred to Dr. Mirmiran
- Meeting on Monday Dr. Archie Holmes to discuss leassons learned from our merger to share with UTSA as they begin the process of merging as well
- Parking new lot if we are student centered, we should not make it completely designated to staff/faculty
- Questions Does having parking for faculty, actually serve students better because they could be available? Completely fair question one size does not fit all; parking for each college is different; do not want the perspective that there are empty faculty spaces and not spaces for students when they are trying to get to class.
- Talk about campus revitalization you have in mind we have no funding yet; very passionate to have a unified entrance with sustenance that people want to use for photo opportunities; better registrar access; consider building out the 4th floor of

- Soules; adequate spaces for organizations; many other things this fall will start construction between Stewart and HPR with a feel of Spanish steps demolition on Thanksgiving break
- Daniel Deslatte plan to add another level to the Soule's parking garage and are looking into a shuttle service to off campus housing as well as a shuttle that would move around the outer perimeter of the campus
- Dr. Philley there are also plans for shuttle service between the two campuses; before this is a reality, the university will provide transportation if an acute crisis occurs with ride share, etc.

Provost Updates, Dr. Amir Mirmiran

- Proud of enrollment management and faculty who have grown enrollment; retention
 has also improved over last year; retention still lower than hoped, so need to work;
 new programs admission (processing applications more rapidly)
- Pharm enrollment and prep for accreditation; have met with the faculty; thankful for Interim Dean Ochoa
- SOM Dean Willis stepped down for personal reasons; Dr. Sue Cox has agreed to serve as Interim Dean while they begin the search for a new dean
- Retreat with the Deans in late summer changing landscape of higher ed: enrollment cliff, nontraditional, 3-year program, outcome based performance funding (already happening for CC) – Texas only state in those surrounding that do not have such funding for universities; microcredentials and prior learning
- Need short term focus; 3 action items:
 - How to address AI so we do not fall behind; AI internal grants; professional development around AI; CETL, ADT, Library, ODL
 - Refreshing the curriculum; real work relevance of programs (aligns with QEP)
 - Professional development and mentorship; Office of Research working based on model they have in Houston as well as UT System; using opportunities from ADT and CETL; similar mentorship with online courses; Provost from UTD to discuss Lead UTD to train administrators (deans, chairs, etc.)
- Question: Concerning refreshing the curriculum, is there any plan to create an internal
 grant that will be used to teach project-based learning with real clients in the
 community if project-based learning is used selectively it is not working well? Yes, we
 would incentivize redesign of selected courses and programming with challenge based
 instructions as well as project based learning; want to not just serve industry, but also
 appeal to students

IT updates, Isai Ramirez, Vice President, Information Technology, Chief Information Officer

- Incidence are trending down down 32% start of this fall compared to last fall semester; accomplished by infrastructure and proactive approach to making sure computers are up-to-date and working well
- New technology assessment focused on accessibility currently by email which
 causes delays; on the health campus there is a form and are planning to roll out to
 main campus; fully expect questions about prior use or use on other UT institutions;
 here to help to ensure in line with law and policies; tickets to IT always have
 hundreds in the waiting for more information; pay attention to emails and respond
 back promptly
- Information security be very vigilant on information security; if you see a suspicious email, report it!; don't approve on Duo if you are not trying to personally log in it only rejects that log on attempt;
- Input: considering extended IT support in the evenings; and revisit the ticket process as it can be very slow on list to provide after hours and 80% of tickets are closed in first contact with user; be sure to reply if a comment is made on your ticket so that they have the needed information to continue to work to resolve the issue
- Question: Can we get help now buttons in all classrooms? Yes, send email and will find a short-term solution until they can be installed
- Input: Wifi connection in grad school on 2nd floor of HPR very spotty; send email with location and they will investigate

Facilities updates, Andrew Krouse, Executive Director of Facilities Management

- Greatly appreciate support in surplus open house; one last one on next Friday between 9-1; after that date, nothing else available for the rest of the year; meet in lobby of Soule's
- Working on shred contract; if needed, contact Andy to see if can be included and will be place strategically around campus
- Just completed 7-year sustainability effort; surpassed the target of 3% reduction of energy with a 14% reduction in electricity and a 30% reduction in water usage
